Subject: Changes to vaccine supply contracts

At the most recent public meeting, on 20 and 21 June 2022, of the Special Committee on the COVID-19 pandemic: lessons learned and recommendations for the future, it was announced that the Commission had reportedly made changes to vaccine supply contracts.
