In the decades since the Outdoor Noise Directive (2000/14/EC) was drafted, extensive scientific research has demonstrated the profound effects of noise pollution on cardiovascular health outcomes¹. Additionally, in response to a previous written question on this subject², the Commission acknowledged the need to update the Directive, specifically with a delegated act which reflects technical progress in noise measurement methods.
