Subject: Sector-specific traffic ban in the Austrian land of Tyrol

As of 1 January 2023, the sector-specific traffic ban is to be tightened in the Austrian land of Tyrol. While only EURO 6 vehicles registered for the first time after 31 August 2018 has been be allowed to transit Tyrol from 1 January 2020, all EURO 6 vehicle traffic from or to Tyrol will be allowed to circulate as from 1 January 2023. In addition, an exception granted for east-west traffic (Cantons of Grison – Vorarlberg – Tyrol) has been extended until 31 December 2023, meaning that all EURO 6 vehicles can circulate (rather than vehicles registered for the first time after 31 August 2018).

- 1. Does the Commission not feel that the differential treatment between vehicles in transit and vehicles travelling from and to Tyrol in the final stages of the ban constitutes discrimination?
- 2. How does the Commission view the extension of the exception for east-west traffic?
- 3. The Austrian land of Tyrol has ruled out any exception for north-south traffic, citing air quality concerns. Should this criterion not also apply to east-west traffic for the sake of consistency?

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
