Subject: Support for and use of Airbus's 'Zephyr'

The defence contractor Airbus plans to begin taking customer requests for flights of its stratosphere-circulating high-altitude platform station (HAPS) 'Zephyr' already this year. The first aircraft in the series is due to enter into service by the end of 2024. A spokesperson for Airbus said that it is near final design and close to being certified. Yet in 2022 a 'Zephyr' model crashed on a long-haul flight.

- 1. What support is the Commission providing to Airbus for the development of 'Zephyr'?
- 2. Under which projects of the EU research framework programme were 'Zephyr' operations developed or tested?
- 3. What stratosphere surveillance services do the Commission or Frontex plan to commission from Airbus, and how much will this cost?
