Subject: Cases of cardiac arrest in Europe

The European Union's long-term preoccupation over the years has been to preserve and protect human life. In this way it promotes health as a supreme good. Nevertheless, studies have revealed a very serious problem relating to cardiac arrests in the EU 27.

This is a matter of great concern since, according to surveys, around 300 000 such cases are recorded annually within the European Union.

- 1. Can the Commission say what steps it taking to provide more information and raise the level of awareness among European citizens regarding the matter?
- 2. What efforts are being made to ensure that people know how to use defibrillators for resuscitation purposes?
