Subject: EU response to contamination by forever chemicals

The European investigative 'Forever Pollution Project'1, carried out in collaboration with Le Mondeand The Guardian, has uncovered that 17 000 sites across Europe<sup>2</sup> are permanently contaminated by 'forever chemicals'.

There are more than 4 700 forever chemicals. With non-stick, non-stain properties, they are useful for making products such as kitchen utensils, clothes and fire-fighting foams.

They can cause many health problems, including hypercholesterolaemia, ulcerative colitis, pregnancy-induced hypertension, thyroid diseases, cancer and reduced vaccine effectiveness.

It should be noted that Belgium is the country most affected by this type of pollution.

- What measures is it taking to protect both the environment and human health from the risks 2. posed by these forever chemicals?
