Subject: Climate change mitigation

The European Commission has already taken a series of measures and put forward packages to address and mitigate climate change. Most of these rules imposed by the Commission impose greater financial burdens on citizens and put a strain on the European economy. This raises a number of questions:

1. The Commission's policy on climate change is hysterical in the extreme. Is the Commission labouring under the assumption that citizens and the economy will put up with these constant new burdens and bans in the long run, or will it have to change its course of action?
2. Does the Commission believe that sufficient account is being taken of the efficiency and usefulness of the various energy sources, and if so, to what extent?
3. Many experts fear that the hasty phasing-out of various energy sources will lead to problems in security of supply. What precautions has the Commission taken with a view to guaranteeing security of supply?
