Subject: Air quality in Thessaloniki

According to an IQAir report, air quality for about 90% of people worldwide in 2022 was unhealthy. In the Thessaloniki region, Vasilika is ranked the 59th worst in Europe in terms of air quality and air pollution, with an average annual $PM_{2.5}$ particulate concentration of 23.9 μ g/m³, Plagiari is ranked the 68th worst in the whole of Europe and Kardia the 71st worst in Europe, with an average of 22.6 μ g/m³. In addition, at national level, there is a high level of pollution in Peraia (21.3 μ g/m³) and Thermi (20.4 μ g/m³), as well as in the city of Thessaloniki (19.7 μ g/m³).

In view of this, and further to the Commission's answer of 10 June 2022 to my question E-001430/2022 regarding air quality in Evosmos, Thessaloniki²:

- 1. What European subsidies are available to fund actions to tackle air pollution in 2023? To what extent have they been taken up by Greece to date?
- 2. In view of the findings of the above report, which show that there was a rise in air pollution in 2022 as compared to the preceding year, does the Commission intend to propose any additional measures?
