Subject: Turkish secret services and Turkish influence in Europe, especially in the Grand Est

Region

In a written question from 16 June 2022¹, I highlighted that 'the Turkish Government's religious diplomacy also extends to Europe, where Türkiye ranks as the most powerful foreign state actor when it comes to influencing Islamic spiritual affairs'².

In particular, the Council for Justice, Equality and Peace (COJEP International) 'is a very influential organisation in the Grand Est Region' and is purportedly 'regularly involved in the efforts made by the Council of Europe and the European Parliament to combat Islamophobia'³.

Furthermore, according to an article in the French magazine *Le Point*from 8 September 2022, the Turkish intelligence and security agency Milli Istihbarat Teskilati (MIT) 'has, according to a report by the German Federal Office for the Protection of the Constitution (BfV), hundreds of agents and 6 000 informers' in Europe⁴.

In 2019, a 'secure building complex for consular affairs measuring 9 000 square metres' – the 'largest Turkish consulate in the world' – was reported to have been inaugurated in Strasbourg, just 'a stone's throw away from the Council of Europe's.

Will the Commission investigate Türkiye's strategic influence in the EU and, in particular, the activities of the MIT and the exact purpose of the consulate in Strasbourg?
