Subject: Reform of the EU Customs Union

On 17 May 2023, the Commission published its proposal for reforming the EU Customs Union. The aim is to create a 'simpler, smarter and secure customs union'. A new EU Customs Authority will oversee an EU Customs Data Hub, which will act as the engine of the new system.

In my view, any changes should primarily contribute to:

- strengthening the competitiveness of the EU economy;
- rendering economic processes and operations in customs legislation and customs clearance flexible
- lessening the burden on reliable businesses and the customs administration by focusing on key risks and reducing red tape;
- assisting small and medium-sized enterprises in the conduct of customs processes in foreign trade.

I should therefore like to ask the following:

- 1. Which representatives of industry were consulted in the drafting of these measures, and to what extent were their insights and opinions integrated into the proposals?
- 2. How are the functionality, reliability and, in particular, the comprehensibility of the EU Trader Portal improved?
- 3. How is a cross-procedural use of comprehensive guarantees made possible?
