Question for written answer E-002031/2023 to the Commission Rule 138 Sara Skyttedal (PPE)

Subject: Private imports of weapons and weapon parts

I would like to raise the issue of private imports in regard to the Commission's October 2022 proposal on import, export and transit measures for firearms, their essential components and ammunition¹.

Private individuals with a licence (hunters, sports and recreational shooters, and collectors) in the EU are currently allowed to import weapons or weapon parts from non-EU countries. However, the Commission wishes to prevent this: 'Only arms dealers and brokers shall be authorised to import semi-finished firearms and semi-finished essential components' (Article 9(3) of the proposal).

In light of the above:

- 1. What is the Commission's assessment of the consequences that the suggested ban on imports of semi-finished firearms and semi-finished essential components by private individuals would have for the legal arms market in the EU in terms of supply and prices?
- 2. Was this factor taken into account during the drafting of the proposal?
