Subject: Lack of quality data on mental health in agriculture

The agricultural sector is under pressure. This is reflected in more suicides among farmers and an overall assessment that mental well-being among farmers is deteriorating. Already in 2020, EU-OSHA published an agricultural welfare report concluding that the agricultural sector was facing serious (mental) health challenges¹.

On 24 May 2023, Eurostat reported² on progress made by the European Union towards the sustainability objectives. As far as mental well-being is concerned, only 'average progress' was recorded, but this finding did not focus on specific sectors. In its Communication of 7 June 2023³, the Commission acknowledged that mental well-being in the agricultural sector was under pressure and expressed its intention to address this issue, but currently lacked the necessary qualitative data.

- 1. How will the Commission collect more data on mental well-being and make it publicly available in a structured and qualitative way?
- Has the Commission already taken steps to collect high-quality data mapping farmers' mental health?
- 3. If so, when does the Commission foresee the publication of the results?
