## Question for written answer E-002186/2023 to the Commission

**Rule 138** 

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Subject: Use of Spanish harbour to circumvent EU embargo on Russian oil

In June 2022, the Council adopted a sixth package of sanctions against Russia. The restrictions apply from 5 December 2022 for crude oil and from 5 February 2023 for other refined petroleum products. In June 2023, there was another direct oil tanker shipment from the port of Taman (Russia) to the port of Motril (Spain)¹. The tanker involved has a gross carrying capacity of 12 970 tonnes². Some countries have already started taking action to stop arrangements that sidestep Russia sanctions³. In answer E-000368/2023, the Commission explained that 'it is aware of the activities involving Russian oil in the Strait of Gibraltar' and that it monitors 'closely circumvention of EU sanctions'<sup>4</sup>.

- 1. Was the Commission aware of this shipment?
- 2. What measures will it take to stop arrangements such as this one that sidestep Russia sanctions?
- 3. Could it explain how it is working with Spanish national and port authorities on this matter?
