Subject: Pressure by our neighbours to do away with Parliament in Strasbourg and striking a

fresh balance in the distribution of job locations for Commission staff

Parliament currently employs 300 staff in Strasbourg itself¹.

Citing savings, by way of a pretext, our European neighbours regularly press for Parliament's seat in Strasbourg to be shut down.

There are, in this connection, a few staggering figures:

- 288 Parliament staff are apparently employed in 'other locations'¹, i.e. not in Brussels, Strasbourg or Luxembourg, which are the three sites under the Treaties;
- the Commission employs 1 655 staff in Italy, 383 in Spain, 255 in Germany, 204 in the Netherlands and 171 in Ireland (i.e. 2 668 staff in total in those five countries), but only 46 in France².
- 1. Given that the Commission employs about 36 times more people in Italy than in France (and four times as many in Ireland), does it intend to act to strike a fresh balance, benefiting France, in the distribution of job locations for its staff?
- 2. What tangible measures has the Commission taken since 2021 to support maintaining the seat of Parliament in Strasbourg and thus ensure the sustainability of the jobs Parliament provides in France?
