Subject: Crash of a second long-range drone operated on Frontex's behalf

Frontex's drones in Malta and Greece are controlled by the German arms firm Airbus. It provides a satellite communications system for them. That system is reported to have failed in a crash off Crete. Back in 2020, a long-distance drone monitoring Greece's maritime borders on Frontex's behalf crashed onto the runway at Tympaki airport in Crete.

- 1. What are the Commission's preliminary or definitive findings as to the cause of the crash on 24 August 2023, and who is in charge of or involved in the investigation?
- 2. What damage was caused when the crash occurred and, as things stand, who bears liability (and to what extent)?
- 3. When is the Heron 1 flight ban in Greece to end, as matters stand at present, and by when might the Frontex drone in Greece be replaced by the manufacturer/contractor?

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
