Question for written answer E-002558/2023 to the Commission Rule 138 Harald Vilimsky (ID), Georg Mayer (ID)

Subject: Cash

In Austria a debate is currently ongoing on whether to enshrine the right to use cash in the constitution. The Commission's representative in Austria, Martin Selmayr, considers this to be a 'denial that we have a common currency in Europe'. In Slovakia, such a plan has already been implemented and the right to pay in cash has been constitutionally guaranteed. There is thus clearly a need for fully watertight legislation.

- 1. Does the Commission share its representative in Austria's opinion and consider the potential enshrining of the right to use cash in the Austrian constitution to be a 'denial' of the common currency?
- 2. Does the Commission intend to have such a right similarly guaranteed at EU level?
- 3. To what extent is whether Austria enshrines the right to make cash payments in its constitution a matter for the Commission or its representative in Austria, and why are these plans being publicly criticised?
