Subject: The dumping of illegal immigrants in Italy by German non-governmental organisation Humanity, which is subsidised by Germany

The German non-governmental organisation (NGO) Humanity, which is subsidised by Germany, dumps illegal immigrants in Ancona, Italy. The vast majority of Germans and Europeans do not support these illegal actions that contribute to mass migration and the destabilisation of European society.

1. Does the Commission share the view that both the NGO Humanity and Germany are to blame for human trafficking and the destabilisation of European society through mass migration?
2. Why does the Commission criticise Hungary and Poland for protecting their countries against mass migration while ignoring the violations of the Anti-Trafficking Directive¹ and the EU Strategy on Combatting Trafficking in Human Beings (2021-2025) by the NGO Humanity and Germany, and does this prove that mass migration is not only tolerated by the Commission but also actively pursued?
