Subject: Complaints concerning the Turów mine

In its answer to Parliamentary Question E-001280/2022(ASW)¹ of 23 May 2022, the Commission stated that with regard to mining in the Turów mine, it was assessing the bilateral settlement between Poland and Czechia and would decide on the next steps to be taken in due course based on the outcome of that assessment. It also stated that it was assessing the outstanding legal questions in the light of the opinion delivered by the Advocate General.

- 1. Given the time that has passed since the Commission's reply and several complaints submitted to it in relation to the Turów mine, will the Commission bring an action against Poland for violating the Environmental Impact Assessment Directive<sup>2</sup>, the Access to Environmental Information Directive<sup>3</sup> and the Environmental Liability Directive<sup>4</sup>?
- 2. Given that pipes for drinking water in areas damaged by the Turów mine will be paid for from EU funds (the European Regional Development Fund and the Cohesion Fund), will the Commission bring an action against Czechia for violating the 'polluter pays' principle?
