Subject: Majority of Poles not in favour of EU Treaty reform

A reform of the EU Treaties was only recently proposed in the European Parliament, and the Poles are now already clearly declaring their opposition to it. A survey revealed that some 52 % of Poles reject such reforms. The EU institutions often regard Polish politics with hostility and take every opportunity to verbally attack the country.

- 1. Is the Commission planning to ensure that similar surveys on this proposal will also be conducted in other Member States, and that the results will have an influence on decision-making?
- 2. Is the Commission taking the rejection of the reforms by the Poles seriously regardless, and is it intending to respond to the results of the survey?
- 3. What is the Commission's opinion of the fact that Euroscepticism among EU citizens could increase as a result of the planned Treaty reforms, and does it consider it a realistic response to this scepticism that other Member States may wish to leave the Union, following the example set by Brexit?
