Subject: Delivery of 'old generation' Pfizer COVID vaccines in 2023

According to the European Centre for Disease Control (ECDC), virtually no doses of vaccine have been administered since mid-January 2023. However, the ECDC has confirmed that deliveries of vaccine doses continued into 2023:

AstraZeneca Vaxveria: 5.2 million doses (April 2023).

Sanofi-GSK VidPrevtyn Beta, around 13.9 million doses:

- 6.1 million (mid-March 2023);
- 5.4 million (end of February 2023);
- 2.4 million (January 2023).

Pfizer Comirnaty (old version), around 14.4 million doses:

- 2.6 million (mid-January 2023);
- 8.0 million doses (mid-June 2023);
- 2.8 million (September 2023);
- 1.0 million (September 2023)¹.

In the last week of December 2022, Pfizer reportedly delivered 5 515 115 doses of 'old generation' Pfizer vaccine as compared to 1 734 520 doses of bivalent vaccine (new version).

1. Can the Commission confirm that Pfizer mainly delivered 'old generation' vaccine doses in 2023, when the ECDC has indicated that this version has not been used since September 2022?
2. Precisely how many 'old generation' Pfizer Comirnaty doses were delivered and administered in the EU in 2023?
3. What is the purchase value of the vaccine doses delivered in 2023?
