Subject: What steps will the Commission take to tackle greenwashing linked to the use of palm oil

substitutes?

In 2022, Parliament and the Member States reached a deal on a new law on deforestation<sup>1</sup>. EU imports are responsible for 10 % of global deforestation. The Commission also proposed a regulation to reduce the damage to forests for which the EU is responsible<sup>2</sup>, but also common criteria to tackle greenwashing and misleading environmental claims<sup>3</sup>. In this context, particular attention has been paid to imported products containing palm oil. It is considered to be one of the main causes of deforestation, although this is now contradicted by some environmental studies<sup>4</sup>. Many brands<sup>5</sup> make a point of saying that they do not use palm oil in their products in order to substantiate their 'environmental responsibility'. However, it is replaced by other oils<sup>6</sup> that are higher in saturated fat and come from crops that are less sustainable and thus need more land, leading to even more deforestation<sup>7</sup>. This practice is therefore similar to greenwashing and deliberately misleads consumers<sup>8</sup>.

What measures does the Commission suggest to tackle this type of greenwashing and raise awareness of this practice?
