Subject: Family-run farms

Family farms dominate EU agriculture in terms of farm numbers, their contribution to agricultural employment and, to a lesser extent, the surface area being farmed and the production value they generate.

Almost six out of ten farms (around 57%) are run by the owner and family members alone. In another 36% of farms, family members made up at least 50% of the total workforce. Family farms accounted for the largest share of the agricultural surface area in 2020 (around 61% of the 157.4 million hectares used), the majority of the total agricultural labour force (almost 78%), more than half of all livestock farms (almost 55%) and more than half of the standard agricultural output (around 56%).

However, without the necessary support, these farms are liable to disappear, since new generations are not interested in careers in agriculture. Between 2005 and 2020 over 37% of farms have disappeared, and that decline unless we come up with viable solutions.

- 1. What specific measures and initiatives is the Commission considering to support family farms in the future?
- 2. How effective are the current strategies for attracting young people into agriculture?
