**Subject:** Condemnation of tributes to ETA members and support to prevent psychological damage to victims of ETA terrorism

In 2020, the European Parliament called for all necessary measures to be taken to prevent victims of terrorism being humiliated by acts such as tributes to ETA members.

The report, which was adopted by the European Parliament's Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs, contained amendments aimed at putting an end to tributes to ETA members and the psychological damage that these acts inflict on victims.

The relevant institutions, whether at local, regional or state level, were asked to provide the necessary safeguards to prevent further victimisation resulting from humiliation and attacks on the victims' image.

It has recently been revealed that, in 2023, more than 450 public events supporting the terrorist group ETA took place in Spain.

In light of this:

1. Is the Commission showing support for the victims of ETA and calling on the institutions to take steps to prevent acts of support or remembrance for terrorists and the criminal gang itself?
2. Does it reject any kind of act or show of support for ETA prisoners who took lives and sought to spread terror to destroy freedom?
