Subject: Does the proposed reform and reauthorisation of the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance

Act cast a doubt over the Commission having signed the Data Privacy Framework?

On 28 February 2023, the European Data Protection Board (EDPB) questioned the US's ability to protect Europeans' personal data¹. However, on 22 December 2023, Section 702 of the FISA², which allows US intelligence agencies to access Europeans' emails and telephone conversations³, was extended until the end of April 2024. Furthermore, Section 504 of one of the draft reforms of the text⁴ – the FRRA⁵ – proposes to extend the scope of this law⁶. It sets out to expand the list of companies that can be drafted into US agencies' service and include cross connects. Data centres (subject to US law) would also be made to install interception modules.

All of this contradicts the EUCS⁷, currently under negotiation⁸, under which the Commission wants cloud providers to be required to demonstrate legal immunity from foreign jurisdictions.

The Commission had signed the DPF⁹, an agreement on data between the US and Europe¹⁰, on the basis that the FISA was going to be less far-reaching.
