Subject: Review of the Posted Workers Directive

Article 2 of Directive (EU) 2018/957¹ requires the Commission to review the directive's application and implementation and submit a report and the necessary amendments by 30 July 2023. This report is crucial for understanding the impact of EU legislation on the posting of workers, particularly in subcontracting-heavy and fraud-sensitive sectors, such as construction and transport, and for non-EU nationals, who account for a growing number of (posted) workers in the EU.

An interim report for a study related to this directive, conducted under tender VT/2021/025, is mentioned in the European Labour Authority's 2023 study on the construction sector, yet the final report has not been published or submitted to the other institutions. Furthermore, Article 2 requires the report to contain specific sections on subcontracting and the road transport sector, suggesting that it was possible to make timely submissions for different sectors.

- 1. What are the reasons for the delay in submitting the report required by Directive (EU) 2018/957, and when can we expect the publication of the final report for the study, particularly as regards subcontracting and the road transport sector?
- 2. Does the Commission see a need to put forward a proposal on subcontracting in the context of the posting of workers, particularly in fraud-sensitive sectors?
