Subject: UNRWA – 10 % of workers linked to Hamas

According to US media reports, 10 % of UNRWA's 12 000 employees are directly or indirectly collaborating with the terrorist organisation Hamas. This means that a large number of UNRWA staff were involved in the terrible terrorist attacks carried out on Israel on 7 October 2023, which resulted in more than 1 200 deaths and hundreds of kidnappings. In light of the above, it is uncertain how the Commission intends to continue providing further financial support to UNRWA using Union taxpayers' money.

- 1. What action does the Commission intend to take beyond the measures announced by Commissioner Várhelyi on 29 January 2024, when talk was only of 12 staff members?
- 2. If the Commission learns the names of the 1 200 accused persons, what direct action does it intend to take to prevent them from being paid with EU taxpayers' money?
- 3. Given the structural problems faced by UNRWA and the large-scale employment of members of a terrorist organisation, does the Commission consider it necessary to call for a change of mandate and thus a change in the tasks entrusted to UNRWA, or even to permanently reassign parts of the funding allocated to UNRWA to other organisations?
