The construction and operation of wind energy projects despite objections from local Subject:

councillors

Wind farms are being built all across Europe, sometimes even against the wishes of local councillors and the general public. One example of this is the construction and operation of a wind energy project in Varrenes-Changy, which is taking place despite opposition from councillors, residents and the inquiry committee. This ideological shift towards green energy represents another step towards worldwide pollution.

This is a proven fact: many reports have revealed that these wind turbines are made with rare materials extracted from mines in non-EU countries (as is the case for cobalt).
