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Subject: Delays in the construction of the Mediterranean Corridor

The Mediterranean Corridor (MC) is the main east-west axis in the TEN-T Network south of the Alps. It will provide a multimodal link for the ports of the western Mediterranean with the centre of the EU. Multimodal connections with ports in Spain have yet to be developed¹.

The TEN-T network is therefore a strategic network to guarantee and enhance the mobility of both people and goods.

Last December the Spanish ministry of transport awarded a contract for the comprehensive remodelling of the Madrid-Vicálvaro terminal, a project to which it will allocate more than EUR 300 million², financed with Next GenerationEU funds. This prioritising of funding is detrimental to the Mediterranean Corridor. Six key milestones of the MC that were pending in 2022 are still pending³, meaning that construction deadlines for the MC are not going to be met.

- 1. Is the Commission aware of the delays in the construction of the MC?
- 2. How is the Commission ensuring that Spain and other Member States use EU funds for priority projects such as the MC?
- 3. How does the Commission ensure that the MC is meeting all agreed deadlines and milestones?
