Subject: Destitution of mobile EU citizens in Sweden

In Sweden, mobile EU citizens are asked to prove their right to stay in the country for at least one year to obtain a personal identification number ('personnummer'), which is necessary to exercise basic rights and access essential services. This requirement leads to many EU citizens being prevented from obtaining a registration certificate, contributing to destitution among those newcomers who cannot obtain year-long work contracts. In 2023, a solution to issue a 'coordination number' for those with job contracts shorter than one year was implemented, but in practice this has a much more limited scope than the personal identification number.

A complaint was submitted to the Commission in 2017 on this matter (CHAP(2017)03524)¹. The meeting of Parliament's Committee on Petitions (PETI) on 23 October 2023 discussed as many as thirteen petitions related to problems with issuing the 'personnummer' for mobile EU citizens².

- 1. Does the Commission acknowledge this is an additional requirement not set out in Directive 2004/38/EC³, hampering the right of mobile EU citizens to reside in Sweden?
- 2. Will the Commission start an investigation to make sure there are no breaches of EU law in Sweden's transposition of the abovementioned Directive?
