Subject: Progress of the digital education action plan (2021-2027)

While the COVID-19 pandemic highlighted the importance of digital transformation, it also exposed problems and inequalities. Digital education is key to building a resilient, inclusive, open and innovative society.

At the EU level, the digital education action plan (2021-2027)¹ set out ambitious objectives. However, it must be executed consistently and successfully, while taking into account each Member State's unique demands and limitations. In this regard:

1. What has the Commission done to address digital inequalities between Member States, regions, social groups, and individuals, and ensure everybody will be guaranteed easy and equal access to digital equipment, connectivity and high-quality learning content?
2. What is the Commission doing to ensure that digital technology is used to improve the quality of education by increasing educators' digital skills and developing high-quality learning content and digital tools?
3. What is the Commission doing to effectively implement the action plan and ensure the cooperation of the Member States in strengthening digital education?
