

PTFE and PVC are not considered as a green listed waste at the international level. Both are subject to scrutiny in the EU because of their properties. The PTFE is in scope of the current PFAS restriction work, while there is also ongoing work on the restriction of PVC.

Justification

Neither PTFE nor PVC is considered as a green listed waste at the international level, this is an exception suggested by the EU. Both waste streams should be classified in accordance with international standards. PVC in particular can contain dangerous chemical additives, and so precaution should be applied with regards to the shipment of this waste stream both

within and outside of the Union. This risks causing issues to EU Member States currently suffering from high levels of illicit waste imports.
