SUGGESTIONS

The Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs calls on the Committee on Budgetary Control, as the committee responsible, to incorporate the following suggestions in its motion for a resolution:

1. Is pleased to note that the Court of Auditors has been able to obtain reasonable assurances that the annual accounts of Eurojust for the financial year ended 31 December 2007 are, in all material respects, reliable, and that the underlying transactions, taken as a whole, are legal and regular;
2. Regrets that as for the financial year 2006 there are high levels of carry-overs and calls on Eurojust to take all the necessary measures to avoid the recurrence of such a situation; takes note of Eurojust's replies in this respect;
3. Takes note of the observations made by the Court of Auditors concerning the procurement procedures and the recruitment planning and of Eurojust's replies on these two points.
