Subject: Safety marking on consumer products

In the framework of the Goods package, questions were raised with regard to the scope of the existing CE-marking and the possible role markings can play in enhancing consumer information on product safety. Whereas members agreed that the role of a possible consumer marking cannot be assumed by the existing CE-marking, they do agree that there is a need for more information about the feasibility and the possible impact of an additional marking. The Parliament therefore requests the Commission:

- 1. to examine the concept of a supplementary marking aiming at enhancing consumer information on product safety;
- 2. to carry out an in-depth study in order to clarify the feasibility, the possible benefits and the potential drawbacks of such a marking for all the stakeholders;
- 3. to examine the possibilities for reinforcing the credibility of the CE-marking, in particular through measures for stronger customs controls inside and outside the EU.
