Subject: Mexican flu

A number of cases of Mexican flu have been diagnosed worldwide, including in Mexico, the United States, Austria and Germany. There is consequently a risk of a worldwide flu epidemic. In order to prevent this it should be ensured that persons coming into contact with pigs or infected persons are vaccinated.

- 1. Is the Commission prepared to propose strong measures pursuant to which Member States would commit themselves to rapidly setting up a flu vaccination programme for people who may come into contact with the virus?
- 2. Is the Commission prepared to take measures to also help promote the carrying out of such a vaccination programme in countries outside the European Union that are confronted with Mexican flu?
- 3. The pharmaceutical industry needs to prepare for a possible pandemic, but supplies are inadequate. Could the Commission give a binding pledge to invest in the development of sufficient antivirals? In addition, is the Commission prepared to invest in the pre-development of medicines and vaccines in order to minimise as far as possible the effects of the possible pandemic? If so, in what way?
