Question for written answer P-007886/2014 to the Commission (Vice-President / High Representative) Rule 130 Lara Comi (PPE) and Giovanni Toti (PPE)

Subject: VP/HR - Flooding in Genoa: EU and Italian Government support

Genoa was recently hit by severe flooding which caused damage estimated at EUR 300 million to property, the cultural heritage, businesses and infrastructure and resulted in a number of casualties.

Although the Solidarity Fund, on which the Italian Government will presumably make a call within the next 10 weeks, will provide much-needed assistance, it is intended to cover emergency operations only.

With reference to the Floods Directive (2007/60/EC), which lays down a framework for the assessment and management of flood risks, and with a view to enabling all available sources of EU funding to be drawn on, can the Commission say:

- 1. what EU funds other than the Solidarity Fund may be used, and what funding can be provided under EU programmes, even on a cofinancing basis, to help repair the damage caused by this disaster and make high-risk areas safe?
- 2. whether Italy has met its obligations under Directive 2007/60/EC, in particular as regards the flood hazard and flood risk maps and related risk management plans provided for in the directive, and whether data are already available on the areas affected?
- 3. whether an exception could be made to the Stability Pact to allow the local authorities to take the action required to make the area affected safe?
