Question for written answer P-001762/2017 to the Commission Rule 130 Marine Le Pen (ENF)

Subject: Undisclosed section of the EU-Turkey agreement on migrants

The German newspaper *Die Welt* has revealed that in March 2016, Angela Merkel and the Dutch Prime Minister, Mark Rutte, pledged (on behalf of the EU) to take in up to 250 000 migrants a year as part of the agreement with Turkey¹. This part of the 'one-for-one' agreement was never disclosed. The statement of the EU heads of state or government of 8 March 2016 says only the following: 'g) implement the existing resettlement commitments and continue work on a credible voluntary humanitarian admission programme with Turkey'.

- 1. Can the Commission confirm these claims?
- 2. Were the Commission and the Member States informed, when the agreement was concluded, that an additional 150 000 to 250 000 were to be taken in each year?
- 3. Why has this part of the agreement with Turkey not been disclosed?
