Subject: Number of civil service committees
In 1997 the Commission calculated that 424 civil service committees took between 4000 and 5000 decisions per year.

On 28 July 2000, in reply to a written question (E-1698/2000), Romano Prodi stated on behalf of the Commission that there were 242 committees, made up of representatives of the Member States, which assisted the Commission in exercising its executive powers. According to Prodi, in 1999, these committees gave more than 2500 opinions on draft implementing measures.

How many civil service committees does the Commission have now, and how many decisions does the Commission estimate that they took in 2016?
