Subject: New agreement between Europol and Israel

On 20 December 2017 the Commission communicated to the Council a 'Recommendation for a Council decision authorising the opening of negotiations for an agreement between the European Union and the State of Israel on the exchange of personal data between the European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Cooperation (Europol) and the Israeli competent authorities for fighting serious crime and terrorism'.

1. Does the Commission envisage that the agreement will contain provisions covering the request of information from Israel by Europol that will enable Europol to request information under the agreement that stems from activities of Israel's authorities in the territories occupied by Israel since June 1967?
2. Does the Commission envisage that the agreement will contain provisions covering the supply of information by Israel to Europol that will enable Israel to transmit information under the agreement stemming from activities of Israel's authorities in those occupied territories?
3. Does the Commission envisage that the agreement will contain provisions that will enable Europol to determine when information supplied by Israel stems from activities of Israel's authorities in those occupied territories?
