Subject: Brexit

The Brexit Party, now the largest party in the EU Parliament and winner of the EU elections in the UK, aims to assist the UK and EU in resolving the Brexit stalemate.

The Brexit Party notes that the Withdrawal Agreement drawn up between the EU and Theresa May's Government was thrice rejected in the UK Parliament. The agreement is not supported by the British public and we call for it to be scrapped.

The Brexit Party considers that with the deadline of 31 October 2019 looming for the UK's exit from the EU and in recognition of Article 8 of the Lisbon Treaty it is in the interests of both the EU and the UK to agree a deal speedily which will allow trade to continue freely between both parties so that jobs are protected and uncertainty removed.

Will the EU commence discussions immediately on the basis of a free trade deal with the British Government?

Will it recognise that such discussions may continue beyond the UK's exit on 31 October 2019 and that Article XXIV of the WTO's General Agreement on Tariffs And Trade will then enable tariff-free trade to continue until such time as an agreement is concluded, for the benefit of both parties?
