Subject: Insecurity among young women in the Union

The Crime, Safety and Victim's Rights' report by the Fundamental Rights Agency (FRA) reveals that 83% of young women aged between 16 and 29 avoid certain places, streets and districts in the European Union for fear of being physically or sexually assaulted. 35 000 people in the Union, the UK and North Macedonia were surveyed: 'Young women in particular avoid certain places for fear of their safety. This is an important issue in terms of equality because it illustrates that women cannot use public spaces in the same way as men.'

Needless to say, the growing feeling of insecurity in the Member States is the direct result of mass migration and the presence of millions Muslims who cannot be integrated.

1. The Commission, through its President, calls the recent Hungarian law on the protection of children 'a disgrace which goes against all European values'. In the Commission's view, do these words also apply to the insecurity felt by young women?
2. Does the Commission intend to issue a letter of formal notice to those Member States which are unable to resolve the issue of insecurity felt by young women in certain neighbourhoods?
