Subject: Inhumane and illegal practices against asylum seekers at the EU's external borders

There has been a recent increase in reports of inhumane and illegal practices directed at refugees and migrants at the EU's external borders, including at locations far from Belarus and Moria. In Croatia, pushbacks have been carried out and asylum seekers have been mistreated<sup>1</sup>. In Libya, EU funds have indirectly facilitated the operation of prison-like facilities where refugees and migrants are detained in the most adverse of conditions<sup>2</sup>.

- 1. How will the Commission involve the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA) in the future in order to ensure that fundamental rights are respected at the EU's external borders?
- 2. Apart from the general reviews under the EU Emergency Trust Fund for Africa (EUTF), will the Commission launch a separate, specific investigation into the above-mentioned prison-like facilities in Libya?
- 3. In addition to appeals to the Libyan Government and indirect support for projects by the International Organisation for Migration (IOM), with a view to directly involving the EU, what measures is the Commission taking to put an end to the human rights situation in the prison-like facilities for migrants and refugees in Libya?
