Subject: Questions on the strategic compass

According to press reports, in November 2021 Josip Borrell, High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, presented a first draft of a 'strategic compass' for the European Union. This is based on a threat analysis which, like the strategic compass, is classified information and therefore not available to the public.

- 1. Who has access to these documents and why are the democratically-elected Members of the European Parliament excluded from accessing this information, and on what legal basis?
- 2. Who is or was involved in drawing up the threat assessment and the strategic compass, and which democratically-legitimised bodies ultimately decide on them?
- 3. How should the European Parliament decide, under its budgetary powers, on expenditure on defence measures in future if these are not made transparent to Parliament?
