Subject: Profiling of EU citizens entering the United Kingdom

The number of citizens of Romania refused entry to Great Britain is the highest for any EU country. Of the 5 266 EU citizens stopped at the border in the latter part of 2021, 56% were Romanian, followed by Bulgarians at 10% and Poles at 7%.

These are shocking figures and I want to check whether there may not also be discriminatory behaviour involved in this process. Since Article 492 of the EU-UK Trade and Cooperation Agreement provides for a reciprocity mechanism to ensure visa-free travel for short-term visits and Article 140 of that agreement covers entry and temporary stay for business purposes:

- 1. Is the Commission is aware of this situation, and if so what has it done and/or does it plan to do in this regard?
- 2. Has a set of criteria been agreed between the EU and the UK on the basis of which the UK authorities are refusing entry to that country?
- 3. Is there an information exchange mechanism on the main reasons for the refusal of entry?
