Subject: 'Do no significant harm' principle and national recovery and resilience plans

Article 5 of the Recovery and Resilience Facility Regulation¹ stipulates that 'the Facility shall only support measures respecting the principle of "do no significant harm" (DNSH). In addition, the Commission has issued dedicated technical guidance to Member States on the application of 'do no significant harm' under the Recovery and Resilience Facility Regulation. Currently, most national recovery and resilience plans have been adopted after scrutiny of the 'do not significant harm' principle. However, the exact procedure and specific details for the projects are not public (DNSH fiche, for example).

- 1. Can the Commission provide an exhaustive list of projects that were included in the submitted draft recovery and resilience plans that were not part of the Council Implementing Decisions because of DNSH related concerns (number and short description of projects per submitted recovery and resilience plan)?
- 2. Can the Commission specify which out of these projects relate to research and innovation?
