Subject: Alleged conflicts of interest and influence trafficking by judges of the Court of Justice of

the European Union and the Commission

A recent French media publication reported on alleged conflicts of interest and influence trafficking by judges of the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU) – including its president Koen Lenaerts, and prominent EU officials associated with the European People's Party (EPP).

The publication includes the following names in relation to the scandal: Johannes Hahn, Jean-Claude Juncker, Jyrki Katainen, Michel Barnier, Barbara Feldman, Koen Lenaerts, Judge Quinn, Helga Berger, Alexandra Sacha Prechal, Nils Wahl.

The EPP-dominated Commission has relied on the CJEU's rulings in its politically motivated decisions for rule of law related-investigations against Poland and Hungary. Furthermore, both the Commission and the CJEU have been increasingly critical in their assessments of corruption in countries such as Bulgaria, Romania and Slovenia.

- 1. Given the foregoing, is the Commission aware of any CJEU judges mentioned in the publication being involved in any CJEU rulings related to rule of law investigations against Poland and/or Hungary?
- 2. If so, which particular rulings were they involved in, and which of those rulings served as the basis for the Commission's decision to continue the so-called rule of law mechanism against Poland and Hungary?
