Subject: REACH Regulation and the French stained-glass industry

On 19 July 2018, the Commission was asked whether it would renew the exemption, provided for under Directive (EU) 2011/65, for lead oxide in crystal glass. This exemption is essential for Baccarat, a renowned glassware company from the Lorraine region¹.

According to the French national trade union for the stained-glass industry (CSNV), the REACH Regulation could lead to a 'ban on lead' which would undermine France's – and specifically Lorraine's – stained-glass industry, as lead is needed for 'assembling stained glass, but also for work on light and colour', both of which are intrinsic elements of stained glass².

Such a ban would impact some 40 businesses in the Grand Est region³.

- 1. Can the Commission confirm that a ban on lead will come in?
- 2. What measures does it intend to take to exempt the stained-glass industry from that ban?
