Subject: Right of access for parliamentarians in laboratories carrying out experiments on animals

In a resolution of 16 September 2021, Parliament called for an end to animal testing and for the use of new testing methods to be encouraged.

In the same vein, a European Citizens' Initiative (ECI) on compliance with the ban on animal testing for cosmetic products, entitled 'Save Cruelty Free Cosmetics', has gathered over 1.4 million signatures in Europe.

A right of access to farms supplying animals and laboratories using animals could be envisaged in order to check their compliance with the requirements of Directive 2010/63/EU on the protection of animals used for scientific purposes.

The purpose of such a right of access would be to verify, as a minimum, compliance with the conditions in which the test animals are kept and the care afforded to them. Promoting transparency in these establishments can only improve the treatment of animals.

- 1. Will the Commission take into account the ECI referred to above, including, where appropriate, in the context of a revision of Regulation (EC) No 1223/2009 on cosmetic products and of Directive 2010/63/EU?
- 2. Would it consider introducing a right of access for national and European parliamentarians and animal welfare associations recognised as a public service?
