During the discussion on the Commission proposal for a regulation on the sustainable use of pesticides¹held at a meeting of Parliament's Committee for Agriculture and Rural Development on 22 March 2023, a representative of the Commission stated as follows: 'Scientists have concluded that our food production system in Europe is no longer sustainable, neither from an economical point of view, nor from a social point of view, nor from an environmental perspective.'

These remarks contradicted a declaration by Commissioner Janusz Wojciechowski², who welcomed the provisional political agreement on the new common agricultural policy (CAP) by stating that 'the new CAP combines higher environmental, climate and animal welfare ambitions with a fairer distribution of payments, especially to small and medium-sized family farms as well as young farmers.' Can the Commission clarify its position with regard to the adequacy of the CAP to achieve sustainable food systems?
