Subject: More budgetary and fiscal flexibility for greater solidarity with Ukraine and the Republic of

Moldova

The EU has shown great solidarity with Ukraine and the Republic of Moldova, providing comprehensive support including humanitarian and military aid. This attests to the importance of the EU's unity, especially in difficult times, and the continued provision of direct support for Ukraine and the Republic of Moldova is key to protecting our way of life. Many countries have allocated significant resources from their own budgets in order to provide this aid, which has generated unforeseen costs and expenses, putting a burden on national budgets and heightening the risks to democracy and social resilience. Complying with the current EU fiscal rules, such as the limits of 3 % of GDP for budget deficits and 60 % of GDP for public debt, has become increasingly difficult, especially with the current high inflation rates.

1. To what extent is the Commission evaluating the possibility of the EU fiscal rules and the excessive deficit procedure being amended by excluding the specific amounts spent on logistical, military and humanitarian aid for Ukraine and the Republic of Moldova from the deficit calculations?

This type of temporary suspension, which has been applied in the past, would offer the EU countries greater budgetary leeway to extend their much-needed support.

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
