# **OPINION**

of the Committee on Regional Development

for the Committee on Budgets

on the draft general budget of the European Union for the financial year 2008 (C6-0000/2007 - 2007/2019(BUD))

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#### SUGGESTIONS

The Committee on Regional Development calls on the Committee on Budgets, as the committee responsible, to incorporate the following suggestions in its motion for a resolution:

- 1 Takes the view that the amounts for regional policy entered in the preliminary draft budget correspond to the needs of the Union in its efforts gradually to reduce development disparities between regions and meet the Lisbon and Guttenberg objectives; therefore calls for all PDB budget lines to be maintained or, where necessary, restored;
- 2 Urges the Commission to guarantee an appropriate level of payment expenditure under heading 1b and create the conditions required for full implementation and uptake of the Structural and Cohesion Funds;
- 3. Stresses Parliament's objective of simplifying and clarifying regional policy practices and administration both within the EU and in the Member States, so that all the appropriations set aside for regional development can be used more effectively and in a more result-oriented way in the Member States, so as to reduce regional differences and achieve the Lisbon and Göteborg objectives;
- 4. Calls for an increase in payment appropriations under heading 1b (Cohesion for Growth and Employment);
- 5. Stresses the need for special attention be given in the draft budget for 2008 to micro, small, and medium-sized enterprises, traditional small-scale commerce, and research and development activities, bearing in mind their role in regional development;
- 6. Recommends that the Commission encourage Member States to take advantage of the Jeremie and Jessica initiatives with a view to ensuring full uptake of structural funding by Member States and regions;
- 7. Expresses its concern about the possibility of extra financing for projects such as the European Institute of Technology being charged to the non-allocated part of the cohesion budget and of this being decided on an intergovernmental basis; calls on the Member States to involve it in any decision in this matter;

### SHORT JUSTIFICATION

Despite the protracted negotiations over the financial perspective and the IIA, the European Commission hopes to be able to approve all the National Strategic Programmes by July 2007 thus avoiding undue delays such as those incurred at the start of the previous programming period. It should be noted at this point that unlike certain other policy areas, whilst overall priorities are set out in the relevant regulations, the precise allocation of funding to different projects is dependent on the Member state's strategic reference framework, which is at present

being drawn up and approved in cooperation with the European Commission and the uptake of Community funds for the agreed operational programmes.

In its Statement of estimate for 2008<sup>1</sup> the Commission reminds us that "All figures for the Structural funds and the Cohesion Fund are derived from the envelope decided in the legal basis and are fully consistent with the ceilings of the IIA". In making its budgetary provisions therefore, the European Commission has assessed budgetary needs taking into account the decisions of the European Council of 2005, the provisions of the financial perspective 2007-2013 and the IAA, the amounts due under ongoing projects commenced under the 2000-2006 programming period, the likely calls for advance payment for the current period. Thus Structural funds 2008 commitments increase by 0.9%<sup>2</sup> and payments<sup>3</sup> by 3.2% whilst the Cohesion fund sees commitments<sup>4</sup> by 14,4% and payments<sup>5</sup> by 36%. It should be noted that one budget line of heading 1b) falls outside the structural/cohesion policy area. This is the budget line for the European Neighbourhood and Partnership instrument (ENPI), which is the cross border cooperation contribution from this heading. This falls under the External Relations policy area.

The need for continued budgetary discipline and the pan European decline in public investment have shifted emphasis on to the need to create the conditions required for

- Net job creation schemes;
- addressing social exclusion;
- > The development of the knowledge based economy.

It is this approach, adapted as it is to the new conditions of Europe 27, which will be the yardstick for measuring the success of Regional policy during the all important mid-term review which will take place in 2008/9. During 2008 the Commission will be closely monitoring the 2000-2006 programming period and the closure of the programmes and projects as well as assessing the impact the policy has had during that period. In parallel it will ensure that programmes take fully into account the priorities of the Growth and Jobs agenda.

The Commission informs us<sup>6</sup> that as in 2007 the share out of commitment appropriations is provisional and based on historical data of the 2000-2006 programming period. Nevertheless, the European Commission is clearly the only institution having access to the required information concerning the full budgetary requirements and it is for this reason that your draftsman proposes that any unjustified changes introduced by Council in its Draft Budget be immediately rectified by Parliament.

The Commission also informs us that ageing of population, especially in some regions and even Member States, due to declining birth-rates, has become one of most important challenges for the future of Europe. Thence it is essential to promote family values and to help
